Flu Shot Clinic Nov 8

HelpCare Clinic will partner with Walgreens and Community Action Partnership of Mid-NE to offer a free influenza immunization clinic.

The flu shots are free to persons who meet HelpCare eligibility criteria, and the clinic is scheduled for 3 to 6 p.m. at HelpCare Clinic.

Walgreens has provided 100 free flu shot vouchers and will help administer the immunizations. Community Action Partnership of Mid-NE will also help provide and administer the immunizations to children.
