HelpCare Clinic expands

Staff members at HelpCare Clinic have no questions about what to do with an additional 1,100 extra square feet of space but to expand. "While we are sad to see UniNet go because of their partnership, we are glad for the clinic's extra space," said Cheryl Bressington, HelpCare Clinic Executive Director.

Previously, the nonprofit clinic shared its

building at 3015 Ave. A with UniNet Healthcare Network. The additional space allows the clinic to increase office space, add a conference/training room, provide a private consultation room and gain one exam room making a total of five.

Numbers in patient growth have increased from the first six months of operation, from 52 to 107 patients.

Patient spotlight

One family new to the community considers the HelpCare Clinic team spectacular. "Thank you volunteers and co-laborers for your heart of service. Your friendliness and good attention make for a pleasant and agreeable environment," Lisvey said.

After arriving in Kearney from Venezuela, the family was in search of medical resources, and a friend recommended the clinic.

Several of the Venezuelan family members needed medical attention. "Whatever problems came up, the staff looked for ways to solve them quickly and positively." The children needed school physicals, Lisvey is diabetic, one child had vision problems, and

another child had medical issues that would eventually require surgery.

Staff members were attentive in responding to the family's needs, beginning with the initial appointment and during follow-up visits.

"We had a good first impression. They built confidence in us with their friendliness and good attention. I especially needed diabetes control," Lisvey said. "We had just arrived in the country, and at the clinic I received laboratory testing. nutritional education and control testing supplies."

The family views the clinic as a mission. "We encourage you
